## Kids Place:

Kids Place saw consistent participation for our programming in July, though numbers will look different from last summer as we did not partner weekly with the Coldwater Parks Program due to major changes in their programming. In 2017, they accounted for 100-125 kids per week in addition to our regular library visitors.

Large program highlights included a full capacity turnout of 24 for the Flower arranging on July $15^{\text {th }}$. In addition, the other Saturday programs featuring the Air Zoo on Mars and Wildlife Recovery birds and Traveling Tales to Australia. The birds especially were enjoyed by all. The Air Zoo floor show was also a full capacity event with $175+$ in attendance at the Recreation Center.


The weekly events divided into age groups of 2-5 year olds, 6-9 year olds, and 10-12 year olds also saw good turnouts. The gymnastics with Miss Maggie, building bird feeders and the building of marble runs, making cool snacks with Miss Val from the MSU Extension, bridges and construction themed building days were especially popular as well.

By far, the most fun for the month was the card board boat building done by our Tween group at the Aquatic center. Most of the boats succeeded in making a lap in the pool, the kids worked together, and lots of fun was had.
