Working to Help the Library and the Community




The new mulch is a big improvement!

May 14, 1917: a special election to be held to decide on the proposition to raise the sum of five thousand

dollars... for the purpose of construction of a concrete road from the east corporate limits to the west

corporate limits on Thicago Street in the village of Bronson.

May 18, 1917 There will be a Patrictic Mass Meeting at the Bronson Coliseum... Everyone is requested to

bring their songbooks, as patriotic songs will be sung. Let everyone arrange to be on hand and make

this meeting a record breaker.

May 22, 1917 Be it recorded for future generations to pender over, that on the evening of May 22, 1917, it did,

with malice afore-thought, snow real snow.

April 20, 1967 Spring Opening, Your Bronson Dairy Queen.

May 11, 1967 Genstruction of the New Methodist Church approved.

May 18, 1967 Police Chief, Llewellyn Hoskins, reported 18 tickets written in April and a total of \$199.10

collected in traffic violation bureau and justice court fines.


