Nearly 120 readers of all ages were in the Summer Reading program and received lots of fun goodies, fair tickets and other coupons. Our adult winner received a Kindle, as did our 10-12 age group winner, a Leap Frog

Read with Me Scout went to a sweet two year old, a book & stuffed rocket, an inflatable alien and a bike went to the three lucky children in the 3-9 age group. Lots of reading took place to be entered to win this summer.

Things are light and bright in the library these days, as the Quincy Township has had all lighting on both levels of the library changed over to LED.

I greeted hundreds of students and parents at the Jennings Open House


in August and the Friends of the Library chatted with many at the Main Street Festival also. 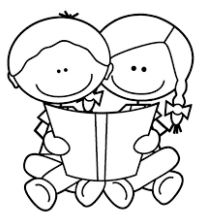

Gifts can also be designated to our Project Fund, which is used for library building needs. Previous projects have supported new lighting, a book drop and shelving.

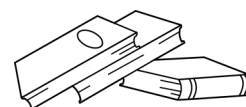
