A BRIEF HISTORY of the COLDWATER KIWANIS CLUB

By OSCAR RENSHAW

Charter Member and 1960 Chairman of the Club History Committee

Our community was inspired during the earlier World War by the ideal of "making the world safe for democracy". When the war produced "pieces with victory" but no peace, we were disillusioned and turned away from world affairs and toward a new American dream of ever increasing abundance of wealth by way of mass production. We were again disillusioned when idleness and bankruptcy became all too common. Idealism and materialism had failed; we were discouraged.

It was then, 1935, that wiser men came out of the east — the land of hills and dales — bringing with them a practical approach to more purposeful living. They talked of Kiwanis with a motto "We Build". Build what? What should we build?

We were told by many men: Harry R. Daniels, President of the Hillsdale Kiwanis Club; Walter Gospell, YMCA secretary; Lieutenant-governor Charley LeFurge of Lansing; Ben Dean, a native of Branch County, then President of the Michigan District of Kiwanis. Their answers seem to be: Men and Communities. We were convinced. A new Kiwanis Club with twenty-eight members was chartered May 8, 1935 under the leadership of Dr. Lemuel Gist.

Kiwanis directed us to the fundamentels of personal and community living. Human and spiritual values translated through the Golden Rule into growth and service to one's expanding community, builds the builder as well as the community, the nation and the world.

This has been Kiwanis in Coldwater for a quarter of a century. It is still more important that Kiwanis is dedicated to these purposes for future years. Surely the greater opportunities are in our youth and their future; the golden age of Kiwanis is still to come.

Since this is an occasion for glancing backward, let us look in our rearview mirror for a few minutes. We see two somewhat parallel tracks extending backward past many milestones to the junction with the mainline of Kiwanis. One track seems to have been made by the events of history, the other by the programs of Kiwanis, as it followed each bend and turn in the succession of events.

Rather than attempt to recognize and reflect what so many Kiwanis men have contributed to the purposes of Kiwanis, let us take an over-all-view of the road we have traveled.

Coldwater Kiwanis was born as Thursday's child in the midst of depression. We worked hard to make the most of the little — we hardly noticed the new war techniques being demonstrated in the Spanish Civil War. Prosperity had to be built — many new things were tried: aid to agriculture, TVA, Social Security and revised neutra'ity laws. Kiwanis commemorated Canada — United States friendship by peace plaques along the border. New goals included the children's hospital project, Citizenship Responsibility and flowers for the living.

The Second World War ended with the establishment of the United Nations based on the idea that peace could be had only if all nations worked for peace as one family of nations. Atomic energy presented a hope and a danger. Kiwanis was active with innumerable projects growing out of the war. To the slogan "All Out for Victory" Kiwanis characteristically added: "And Build Peace".

The post-war years brought us inflation and a period of fear and hysteria. Kiwanis emphasized more service to youth, support of churches, and an objective: "Citizenship Responsibility, the Price of Freedom". This is a new version of a basic principle of Kiwanis. Kiwanis knows that Freedom is not free but has to be built upon a foundation of faith, loyalty, and service, and now it seems that it must be built everywhere. This is the doctrine upon which Kiwanis has grown and flourished; this is the seed that has brought forth 184 Kiwanis Clubs with 9,311 members in Michigan alone.

The 1950's tested the United Nations' ability to deal with the problems of the world. We have experienced a cold war, exploration into space, Explorer Satelite, and presidential good-will tours. Kiwanis has proposed Key Clubs and the theme: Freedom is up to you. So is your life and your community.

We would like to pay special tribute to the late Virgil Hungerford; who, as one of the organizers, a charter member, and club officer, was a constant worker and an inspiration to our club throughout most of its history. Other charter members who have rendered twenty-five years of service to Kiwanis are: .Carl McConnell, George Kelsey, Rolph Carlisle, Oscar Renshaw and Joseph Watson.

We pay tribute to Kiwanis for its objectives and its counterpart of inspiration, materials, man power and organization to fulfill its motto — "WE BUILD".




