 - In Kid's Place they are celebrating Earth Day. Ruth and John put together a mock rain forest with trees and decorations and a

- Coldwater Public Library (Holbrook Heritage Room): Minutes of April 9, 2007.
 - The Heritage Room has a whole series of events planned for the entire week.
- Quincy Branch: Kranz reports.
 - Story hour has had 20 in attendance quite regularly.
 - The reception for Bobbi Brickey was held May 20th, for her 35 years of service to the Quincy library. There were over 60 people in attendance. It was busy from 2 4. The book that was donated by the BDLS Board was on display, along with several other books donated in honor of Bobbi.
 - Michigan Week will be celebrated with bookmarks, Michigan quiz questions for children and the public and we have a small giveaway for anyone who knows the Michigan pledge.

 - Summer reading children will begin sign up the week school lets out, June 12th. We will be running a PreK-8th grade program, with a possibility of a high school program. Discussion to take place at the May 22nd Friends' meeting.

- Sherwood: Mills reports.
 - Stevens Puppets presented Sleeping Beauty. About half the people there were from Bronson.
 - We are getting ready for our annual book sale during the Village-wide garage sales on June 23rd.
 - Summer Reading Club will start June 12th.
- Union: Kaniewski reports.
 - I am happy to report a site for Union Twp. Library has been found! It is on the corner of Broadway & High Street that is currently a parking lot. The Village Council agreed to the location on Monday, May 14th. At the Township meeting on Tuesday, May 15th, a unanimous vote was given to accept this location as acceptable for the new library.
 - Fabiano's Breakfast Buffet brought in \$1,100.00 to the Building Fund.
 - The Chatterbox Fish Fry brought in \$1,426.05.
 - A bake sale held at the Southern Michigan Bank brought in \$844.22 on Friday May 18th.
 - The total Building Fund is currently at \$27,894.54.
 - Many more fundraisers have been scheduled throughout the summer including:
 - 1) An Auction on June 30th, at 9:00 A.M.
 - 2) July 3rd, Fireworks evening Kiss the pig Various "dignitaries".

 - During all this we are planning Summer Reading! It is scheduled for June 11 July 20th, 2007. Needless to say, we have been busy!
 - Memorial Day we will be having a plant and book sale.

 - Statistics from Dear Reader.com show that 95 new members have joined between the time of National Library week and May 1st. and we have had 1,900 hits on the website.
 - Linda Birkenbeul is retiring.
 - Rural Libraries was very interesting. We are hoping to get on MelCat this summer. The future of small libraries is in danger of not being able to continue without state funding. Our Co-op is healthy compared to the other Co-ops. However, we (the Co-op) are not equipped to go on for years without state aid. The thing that is affecting our library (Branch District) is that the state is not making the payment to us of \$18,000.
- 8. Automation report: Rucker reports.

 - Motion made by Cherry, supported by Frick, to approve the recommendation of the Building Committee and purchase the air conditioner for the server room from Aker, Inc. from the Major Projects Fund. Motion carried. Rucker will check with Aker on an extended service contract.
 - Motion made by Cherry, supported by Chan, to adopt Internetaccessibility changes proposed by Rucker and to get a final policy in place and hand it out next meeting. Motion carried.
 - Motion made by Cherry, supported by Reppert, to adopt a Freedom of Information Act Policy that designates the Director as the coordinator and establishes costs for copies and staff time for additional time spent fulfilling Freedom of Information Act requests. In addition to that, it is also moved to designate the director as the person to respond to any FBI National Security letter. Our Director is to be directed to provide nothing prior to consulting with the attorney for the library. Motion carried.
 - Motion made by Cherry, supported by Chan, to replace the servers with TLC for \$14,813 from the Capital Automation Fund. Motion carried.
