I'm sorry that your experience at the Coldwater Branch was less than you had expected. Libraries have definitely changed over the years with regards to the noise level they tolerate. In fact, some libraries even have slogans these days like "Shhhh' never happens here".

Our goal here is to find the balance between bedlam and total silence to make the library a welcome place for all kinds of guests. The area around the main help desk, including the computer lab, is not one of our quiet areas due to all the activity that goes on there and the help that people need there. The tables on the 3rd floor are our quietest areas if you're looking for a quieter place to be.

But it does seem we may have missed the mark here. Your message is a good reminder that we as library staff can and should do what we can to keep conversations relevant and to a minimum, and to do so without greatly increasing the noise level, and I will be bringing this to the attention of our staff.
