Our library and the Village of Quincy has certainly been bustling since our last October newsletter. Area citizens thoroughly enjoyed the mural being created during the August Quincy Daze events. It was thrilling to watch this masterpiece come to be. The barber shop mural by artist Thor Goodlife Alward of Allen was featured in a front page article in the December 8, 2012 Daily Reporter, and rightfully so! He created the mural from a photo found in our collection here at the library.

November brought the Book Sale and our Friends of the Library were extremely helpful in running it successfully. They also provided their delicious baked goods for our library district "Geek" party also back in November. The Coldwater Branch hosted the party which brought 200 people in to celebrate all that our libraries have to offer. Our Friends also offered refreshments in the Swallow's Nest during "Quincy Lights"

while the dulcimer group provided beautiful Christmas music, and cookies were enjoyed by area children in our lower level while they wrote letters to Santa (hosted by the Quincy Chamber). We were a drop off location for Toys for Tots in December and also hosted local author Kay Reno as she discussed her new book "Stand-In". Congratulations to Shayla Ford who received the gift bag full of goodies from the Quincy Lights drawing.

Our library is a busy place, with an average of 1000 patrons through the doors each month. On average 200 people use our free Internet service monthly, but countless others take advantage of our 24/7 wireless which can be accessed by parking in front of the library or being close to the building after hours. Our fax machine is always running, reference questions are being asked and we send out and bring in nearly 300-400 items monthly to and from libraries within the state. What great services libraries offer!

As a new year begins, our library is grateful that we will still be open 25

hours a week to serve the public, though we were in hopes of being able to reopen on Thursday's, but the budget cuts just don't allow. The district has had to make some major cuts that affected all six libraries in our system.

But a shining light during these hard times has been our local community and it's wonderful support of our In Memoriam/In Honor program. These donations are very appreciated, and help us purchase new books!!

# Library Board Update

I'll briefly highlight some of the things that happened during the summer. There didn't seem to be enough to do an article on them for the last newsletter but they are worthy of being mentioned.

In June, Renee Hardy celebrated 25 years of serving Quincy Branch patrons. NIKA Club donated the proceeds from their annual May auction for the benefit of the library amounting to \$1323. In July, Quincy Branch hosted the monthly Branch District board meeting. Imaginative Arts by Marnie Szafranski held during the summer was another big hit with the children.

Upon the death of Marian Smith, a bronze statue was purchased with memorial money that will complement the two purchased in Gerry Smith's memory. A plaque "Story Time" has been placed in front of all 3 commemorating their lives. Check it out!

The Grandma Mishler's Memorial Fund for Young Readers, created in Jennie Mishler's memory, continues to grow. Five books a year up to \$100 will be purchased each year on the anniversary of her birthday in February.

We also have the Jane Baldwin Memorial Fund and use these monies to fund children's programs for the younger patrons.

Both the Mishler and Baldwin Funds are great ways to remember a special person, support the library and add to our children's book selection.

In October, the Foundation held its annual meeting with the following board being elected: President Teddy Sinclair; Vice President Mary Jo Kranz; Secretary Judy Dobson and Treasurer Connie Karney along with Trustees Carol Ludlow, Barb Rockhold and Lisa Wood. The library board also elected officers and they are the same as the Foundation.

A photo album was purchased to keep copies of Quincy postcards made from Bill Carlson's collection.

Recently two programs have taken place to keep libraries and their importance uppermost in the minds of the community. A "What Do You Geek" program funded by the Gates Foundation finds posters and tee shirts being made with a photo of you along with the words – I geek \_\_\_\_\_\_.(You fill in the blank with your passion be it dolls, computers, quilts, golf, whatever.) The second program was the Polar Express train ride held recently that made the book "Polar Express" come alive for the

children complete with Santa handing out a bell to each child as in the book.

We look forward to the new year with anticipation even with all the challenges it brings.


