- There are more public libraries than Starbucks in the U.S.-a total of 17,566 including branches. Nearly $100 \%$ of public libraries provide Wi-Fi and have no -fee access to computers.

## Update from Advisory Board Secretary:

Catch up items from the Quincy Library Advisory board starting at the first of 2017:
In January, a full-time Teen Librarian, Jessica Tefft, was hired by the Branch District Library System. She works out of the Coldwater office but is helping branch libraries with their teen programs. She has an ambitious schedule and plans a project/program once a week for the teens.
The Winter Blahs reading contest held the month of February had 75 adults participating and 473 books were read. Not much time for blahs!
In an inspection of the Quincy Library by the township, it was suggested that we should have lighted exit signs denoting the exits from the library in case of an emergency.
During National Library week in April, the board presented hanging baskets to Lisa Wood for celebrating 16 years as our librarian and Renee Hardy for serving as our clerk for 30 years. How the time flies.
Jennings' teachers and students have taken the restoration of the Quincy Library very seriously and together raised $\$ 1310.15$ during the March is Reading month theme "READ-SAVE THE LIBRARY". What a great way for the children to be aware of and support community needs.
During April, four Amish classes comprised of 52 children visited the Quincy Library.
The Quincy Chamber of Commerce gives the library $\$ 50$ for flowers for the urns at the library and Teddy Sinclair carries this project out. Renee fertilizes them through the summer.
In May, six elementary classes visited the library and had a chance to sign up for the summer reading program "Build a Better World". Hopefully, this encouraged them to continue reading during the summer. In June over 280 children and adults signed up for the summer reading program-the biggest number so far.
In July, the District Library Board held their monthly meeting at the Quincy branch. Bonnie Frick furnished refreshments for their enjoyment.
August brought much activity to the library with the restoration of the steps and stone work around them. The back stairs and door that were unusable were filled in and stonework to match the front was installed. Yet to be done is replacing some of the sidewalk, reworking the drains and new edging installed around the landscaping. You may want to pay particular attention to the stonework being done at the library. This is an art form few people do any more. With this library being a historical building, any restoration done needs to be as it originally was built.
In August a Cutest Dog Photo contest was held at the library an 69 people voted for their favorite dog.
Lisa attended a conference on "Youth Mental Health First Aid" in Charlotte recently. As a result, she is now certified for 3 years as a Youth Mental Health First Aider.
At 98, Mary Cronmiller decided to retire from volunteering at the librarysomething she has done for years. What a wonderful gift she has been to the library. Thank you, Mary.
