

## Price of Milk in Quincy Raised Two Cents a Quart


Effective Monday of this week, retail milk prices in Quincy advanced from eight to 10 cents a quart. All distributors joined in the advance.

Roy Baker, of Baker's Dairy Plant, said the raise was due to the decrease in the supply of milk and increased costs of production. Retailers in most other southern Michigan towns have been receiving 10 cents a quart for some time.
