90 days to maturity 25 seeds

Boasting handsome uniform dark-green 5-6" heads, Umpqua is a great producer of abundant

side shoots over a long harvest window. An ideal home-garden variety for the fall.

Start broccoli indoors
March-May for setting
out May-July, or direct
seed in early June for a fall
crop. Space plants 18"
apart and keep them
well-watered.

Use floating row cover to protect tender young seedlings from flea beetles. Remove cover once plants reach half growth.

3" apart, in blocks of 4 rows 3' apart, when soil warms to 60°. Thin to 1' apart. Heavy feeder.

Matchbox Hot Pepper OG

75 days to maturity 0.2 gram packet; about 30 seeds

Upright 2" long peppers ripen to deep scarlet on prolific squat plants. Bears well in challenging conditions. Can be potted and overwintered. Plenty hot at 30,000-50,000 Scovilles.

Start indoors in March or April.
Peppers germinate best at temperatures between 68–95°. Set out plants in June, spacing 18" apart. Will not tolerate frost, dislikes wind, and will not set fruit in extreme conditions. Black plastic mulch recommended.

Warm nighttime temperatures stimulate maximum development of capsaicins and increase pungency levels, expressed in Scoville units.

3 Root Grex Beet OG

54 days to maturity 1/8 oz packet; sows 20 feet

An interbreeding mix of three heirlooms with three distinct colors: a pinkish red with some orange in it, a bright gold, and a beautiful iridescent orange.

Elongated roots can be as much as 3½" across and 7–8" long. Also produces copious greens.

Beets are hardy and can be sown as soon as ground can be worked, once soil temperatures reach 40°.

Sow seeds 1/2" deep in rows 12–18" apart. For full-sized beets, you must thin to at least 3" apart. Baby-beet thinnings cooked with tops are a Yankee delight!

Siegfried Frost Leek OG

120 days to maturity 1/16 oz packet, about 400 seeds

With stalks growing as much as 4" across, this leek often withstands the rigors of winter to offer a delectable spring treat.

Start indoors in late February and transplant out in spring as soon as the ground can be worked. Set 6–12" apart in trenches or welldug beds with lots of organic matter. Avoid transplanting next to grass strips; slugs love to dine on tiny allium seedlings.

Leeks will hold in the field until November, but brought into the root cellar they survive almost all winter if heeled into soil.

Summer Lettuce Blend

42 days to maturity 1 gram packet; sows 13 feet

A special selection of red, green and bronze lettuce varieties that most years will stand well into July

without bolting. At least a halfdozen different lettuces, all suitable for cut-and-comeagain culture. Our bestselling lettuce mix.

Direct seed as soon as ground can be worked and repeat every 2 weeks for continuous supply. Sow 1/8" deep, 4–6 seeds per inch, in rows 4–8" apart.

Harvest when leaves reach desired size, taking care to leave growing tips intact for effective regeneration.



Torch Tithonia

120 days to maturity 20 seeds

Annual. Also known as Mexican Sunflower.
Attract butterflies and bumblebees with these 6' tall floriferous beauties. Smooth dark green leaves with dressy scarlet blooms that often exceed 4" across and continue over a long season.

Sow outdoors after danger of frost, once soil has warmed to 70–85°, or start indoors 6 weeks before last frost date. Seeds require light for germination. Thin to 18" between plants.

Heat-loving plant closely related to the zinnia. Tithonia sulks in the cold so don't bring it out too soon.

Black Zucchini

50 days to maturity 1/16 oz packet; sows about 3 hills

Superior flavor and standard yields of dark green firm fruits with tender flesh and small seed cavities, best picked around 6". Open plant habit makes picking easy.

Sow in hills 4' apart, 4 seeds/hill. Thin to 2-3 best plants. Use wire hoops and row cover to keep out cucumber beetles. Make succession plantings every 2-3 weeks to ensure harvest through the entire season.

For best flavor, pick when fruits are small. Leaving oversized squash on the vine shuts down production.
